Late side effects can happen months to years after you receive radiation therapy. Late side effects of radiation therapy may be permanent. Early and late side effects may include any of the following: Fatigue or loss of energy

Side Effects of Radiation Therapy—What You Need to Know

Radiation not only kills or slows the growth of cancer cells, it can also affect nearby healthy cells. Damage to healthy cells can cause side effects. Many people who get radiation therapy have fatigue. Fatigue is feeling exhausted and worn out. It can happen all at once or come on slowly.

Standard radiation treatments to the brain can cause inflammation and impairments to cognitive functioning. The new technique fractionates the dosage and delivers it over several sessions. Radiation can cause side effects that make it hard to eat, such as nausea, mouth sores, and throat problems called esophagitis. Since your body uses a lot of energy to heal during radiation therapy, it is important that you eat enough calories and protein to maintain your weight during treatment.

Long-Term Side Effects of Radiation Therapy

While you're undergoing radiation treatment, the first thing you'll likely notice will be a change in the color of your skin, from pink to red. If you have a dark brown or black skin tone, the redness can be harder to see but you may still have other symptoms, such as soreness or dry skin. Some areas of your skin may react more than others:

Many of these side effects can be treated or prevented and most will pass after treatment stops. External radiotherapy does not make you radioactive, as the radiation passes through your body. Managing Skin Problems From Radiation Therapy

The most annoying and uncomfortable side effects of radiation therapy involve the skin of the area being treated. In many ways your skin reaction will be like a sunburn, with a mild to moderate pink color or redness, with itching, burning, soreness, and possible peeling.

Radiation therapy directed at the chest area can lead to shortness of breath, difficulty swallowing, cough and fever (also called radiation pneumonitis), and a condition known as radiation fibrosis, which causes permanent lung scarring. Mouth and tooth issues

Your skin in the radiation treatment area might look red, irritated, swollen, blistered, sunburned, or tanned. After a few weeks, your skin might become dry, flaky, or itchy, or it may peel. This is sometimes called radiation dermatitis. It ' s important to let your cancer care team know about any skin changes.
